INCARNATION CATHOLIC SCHOOL ADMISSION POLICY AND PROCEDURES

2017-2018

As a parish school, Incarnation must give priority to children of Incarnation Parishioners, using the priorities detailed below and presupposing available space. Students currently enrolled in the school will be admitted before any new admissions, provided they are officially registered during the re-enrollment period. While it is our goal to accommodate all interested families, please be aware that registration does not guarantee entry into Incarnation School's program. New students registered and not admitted due to lack of space are placed on a wait list. Please review the *Admission Policy Guidelines* on the back of this page for more detailed information.

The Incarnation School admission process begins with submission of the following: Application for Admission form; Request for Information form (for students applying for grades 1-8); original County birth certificate; Social Security Card (for verification purposes); copies of Baptismal, Reconciliation, and First Communion certificates (when applicable); and payment of the registration fee. All students applying for Preschool 4's, Early Fives, Kindergarten or Grade 1 will be tested for placement purposes before admission approval. Students in other grade levels are tested for placement purposes at the discretion of the appropriate teachers and/or administration. All applications are reviewed by the Principal for final approval. All accepted students are admitted in accordance with this Admission Policy. Official acceptance letters and related documents are mailed upon admission approval.

ENROLLMENT PRIORITIES FOR NEW STUDENTS

First Priority Enrollment

Siblings of students currently enrolled in the school will have first priority – admitted in order by parents' parish or school registration date, whichever is earlier. <u>To be considered First Priority entering First Grade, siblings must have been registered for the Incarnation School Kindergarten Program.</u> See Section 6 below for financial assistance information.

Second Priority Enrollment

New students whose Catholic parents are parishioners of Incarnation Parish* will have second priority – admitted in order by parents' parish registration date or school registration date, whichever is earlier. See Section 6 below for financial assistance information.

Third Priority Enrollment

New students whose parents are members of another local Catholic parish that does not have a school will have third priority (St. Augustine, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Ignatius, St. Mary) – admitted in order by school registration date. A letter from the home parish is required confirming the parents are registered parishioners in good standing. Financial assistance is not available from Incarnation Parish, but a special tuition rate applies. Financial assistance may be available from home parishes.

Fourth Priority Enrollment

New students who are not Catholic parishioners will have fourth priority – admitted in order by school registration date. While space may be limited, we welcome families from outside the Incarnation Parish community. Financial assistance is not available to non-parishioners.

Session Placement Policy for Preschool 4's (P4) and Early Fives (E5) Students

<u>Enrollment</u> priority will follow the guidelines above. Half day P4 and E5 students are assigned to AM or PM session based on available space, admission priority, age range considerations and extended day enrollment.

ADMISSION POLICY GUIDELINES

1. NOTICE OF NONDISCRIMINATION POLICY

We accept all students regardless of race, religion, sex, ancestry or national origin (Archdiocesan Admission Policies, 502.02). Notwithstanding our open admission policy, it must be noted that the purpose of this parish school is to provide the opportunity to attend a Catholic school to Catholic children whose parents are parishioners of Incarnation Parish as defined in section 5 below. Specific priorities and guidelines help to provide a fair acceptance. All families will be subject to an orientation process before final acceptance into the Incarnation School program.

2. PRIORITIES

In the event that all children registered within a given priority cannot be accepted due to class size limits, a wait list will be formed and the order of admission within each priority will be:

- Students registered during the previous year but not admitted due to lack of space or professional recommendations. Families must re-register before the end of our open registration period.
- Students registered during open registration. Families vying for the same placement will be admitted in order by their parish or school registration date, whichever is earlier.
- Students registered after open registration are admitted in order by school registration date until classes are filled.

3. WAIT LIST

A wait list for each grade level will be maintained for those children registered but not admitted due to space limitations. Students on the wait list must *re-register* for the next school year if they are not called during the wait list period of one year. A student will be dropped from the wait list and lose his or her priority if:

- . An opportunity for enrollment is refused, or
- Families do not re-register before the end of our open registration period. (Dates are posted in the Church bulletin and online each year.)

4. KINDERGARTEN, EARLY FIVES, and PRESCHOOL 4's PROGRAMS

Incarnation School's Kindergarten program prepares students for our first grade program, and as such it is preferred that students attend Incarnation's Kindergarten. Children admitted into the Incarnation School Kindergarten or Early Fives program must be 5 years of age on or before September 30 for Kindergarten and October 31 for Early Fives. Children admitted into the Preschool 4's program must be 4 years of age on or before September 30. Admission for these programs is determined on an individual basis. All Preschool 4's, Early Fives, and Kindergarten students are tested for placement purposes prior to admission approval. Current Preschool 4's and Early Fives students are re-evaluated for admittance into Incarnation School's Kindergarten program.

5. PARISH MEMBERS

To be considered a parishioner of Incarnation Parish, Catholics must register with the Incarnation Parish Office and must not be registered members of another Catholic parish. In order to receive the most benefit from parish membership, Catholics should participate in our weekly Mass celebration, provide talents that enhance the loving community of our church, and we ask that they contribute at least \$600 annually or \$50 per month as an average. When space is available, we welcome families from outside the Incarnation Parish community.

TUITION PAYMENTS / FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Timely tuition payments and support of the school community are expectations for continued enrollment at Incarnation School. Tuition is paid through the FACTS payment program. All families must have an <u>active</u> FACTS tuition payment account by July 1 of each year, or within two weeks of acceptance if registering after July 1, to be considered registered for Incarnation School. Families have the option to pay in full by June 30 or participate in the ten-month payment program. A limited financial assistance fund is provided through the generosity of Incarnation Parish. Families who have been registered active parishioners of Incarnation Parish for at least one year are eligible to apply for financial assistance. All applications for assistance must be completed online through the FACTS payment program. Our Pastor, Fr. Stretch, will make final determination of tuition aid.

7. SPECIAL NEEDS STUDENTS

Incarnation School, through state funding, offers the following programs for students with special needs: School Counselor, Intervention Specialists, Speech/Language Pathologist, Reading Specialists, School Psychologist provided by the Centerville City Schools District, and School Nurse. While the goal at Incarnation School is to provide the best Catholic education for all of our students, restrictions may arise due to federal and state regulations as well as limited funding and personnel. If your child has a special need or has been placed on an IEP/ISP (Individualized Education/Service Program), any special needs must be indicated on the Admission Application and a copy of your child's IEP/ISP and ETR (Evaluation Team Report) must also be submitted at registration to determine if Incarnation School can provide the least restrictive environment for your child and for auxiliary service planning purposes.

FINAL DECISIONS FOR STUDENT ADMISSION WILL BE MADE BY THE PRINCIPAL.

Registration and fees for Morning Care and After School Care are separate from tuition. Information is provided in the admission packet and is available outside the school office. Registration for these programs begins in May for the following school year.

2017-18 TUITION and FEE INFORMATION

Incarnation Parish is dedicated to provide a quality Catholic education to families at a fair and equitable tuition rate. Under the guidance of our pastor, Fr. Mierenfeld, the Incarnation Finance Committee works very hard to keep the tuition as low as possible for families. Teachers and administrators are vigilant about all expenses, and annually receive grants that bring additional money and innovative curricular programs to the school community. The Parish supports the school by providing funding from the weekly collections that keeps the tuition rate as low as possible.

1. Parishioner Tuition Rates

The parishioner tuition rates are based on the total instructional and operational costs for the school with the expectation of active participation of the parish families. To be considered a parishioner of Incarnation Parish, Catholics must register with the Incarnation Parish Office and must not be registered members of another local Catholic parish. In order to receive the most benefit from parish membership, Catholics should participate in our weekly Mass celebration, provide talents that enhance the loving community of our church, and we ask that they contribute at least \$600 annually or \$50 per month as an average. When space is available, we welcome families from outside the Incarnation Parish community.

2. Special Tuition Rates - Catholic Parishes Without Schools

Through an agreement between Incarnation Parish and certain other Catholic parishes <u>without schools</u> (St. Augustine, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Ignatius and St. Mary), a special rate is available to registered members of those parishes. To be eligible for this discount, families must provide a letter from their home parish <u>annually</u> confirming their status as parishioners in good standing. Letters must be submitted to the school office at registration for new families, or by May 1st each year for current families.

3. Non-Parishioner Tuition Rates

When space is available, we welcome families from outside the Incarnation Parish community. Families whose status does not match those listed in #1 or #2 above are considered "non-parishioner". No multi-student discount is available for non-parishioner families.

4. Non-Immigrant Foreign (F-1) Student Rates

The foreign non-immigrant student tuition rate includes an assessment used to cover funding lost from the State of Ohio and expenses of preparation of SEVIS documentation. No multi-student discount is available for foreign students.

5. Technology Fees

A per student **Technology Fee** is added to the tuition total and included in your FACTS statement. The technology fee is billed as a separate amount because this money is specifically dedicated for technology. While this fee certainly does not cover all technology expenses, it does provide Incarnation School with the resources to maintain and upgrade the school's technology. The fee includes technology expenses specific to our one-to-one student technology access.

6. Activity Fees

The **Activity Fee** covers all field trips, homeroom fees, workbooks, and special programs and projects. Activity fees are billed with your tuition and included in your FACTS statement.

Tuition Payment Options

Timely tuition payments and support of the school community are expectations for continued enrollment at Incarnation School. Tuition and fees are paid through the FACTS Tuition Management program. All families must have an <u>active</u> FACTS tuition payment account by July 1 of each year, or within two weeks of acceptance if registering after July 1, to be considered registered for Incarnation School. Families have the option to pay in full by June 30 or participate in the ten-month payment program.

Financial Aid

A limited financial assistance fund is provided through the generosity of Incarnation Parish. Families who have been registered active parishioners of Incarnation Parish for at least one year are eligible to apply for financial assistance. All applications for assistance must be completed online through the FACTS payment program. Our Pastor, Fr. Stretch, will make final determination of tuition aid.

Early Withdrawal / Late Admission

Families withdrawing from school before December 31st will be reimbursed a quarterly prorated amount. Reimbursements will not be remitted after December 31st of the current school year. Final assessment may be billed based on the date of student withdrawal. All assessments are due before school records will be forwarded. Tuition for students admitted during the school year will be charged on a quarterly basis.

INCARNATION CATHOLIC SCHOOL Before and After School Programs 2017-18

To better serve our school families, Incarnation offers programs for both before and after school care. Families may pay a single registration fee for both programs; however, they are priced and billed separately. Please see below for details of each program. Fee schedule and Registration Form are attached. Thank you for considering this option for your family!

Morning Care Program (before school)

7:00 a.m. – 8:10 a.m.

Morning Care is offered for those who are in need of a safe, nurturing environment prior to the school day.

The Morning Care Program, located in multi-purpose room of the school, will open at 7:00 a.m. This will be a quiet time to study, to finish homework, and to interact socially with other students through playing board games, building Legos, working on puzzles, creating art projects, etc. At 8:10 a.m., students will be walked to their homerooms.

A limited selection of cold breakfast items, such as breakfast bars, cereal, yogurt, milk, and juice is available. Breakfast items (up to 2 per day per student) are included at no extra charge. However, please be aware that this is not intended to replace a full breakfast.

Please note: We do not provide service on days when the school is on a two hour delay.

After Care Enrichment (ACE) Program (after school)

3:15 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.

The After Care Program has been approved by the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Service is provided on days that school is in session, except the last day of school. *We do not provide service on days that school is closed.* The students are divided according to grade level into two classes: Pre-school through first grade, and second grade through eighth grade.

The After Care Program benefits many families of Incarnation by providing a safe, Catholic Christian environment for their children where all caregivers and students show respect and kindness for each other. Our structured program begins with recess and a snack. Students play outdoors if the weather permits or play large group indoor games in bad weather. A quiet time is provided for students to study or work on homework. After homework is completed, students may play in the gym, play indoor games or work on art projects.

Drop-in students are welcome to attend, but they must be registered in advance. We can allow children to attend when registration is not complete, but the registration fee will be added to the first billing.

Please note: On EARLY DISMISSAL days ACE will be available, but will end at 4:00.

A Note from the Clinic

Welcome to Incarnation School! I am Ann Woeste, the Registered Nurse in our school clinic. Our clinic is open every day during school hours. Our primary goal in the clinic is to foster a healthy school environment which helps students to grow and learn.

Here is some important information:

- The School Health Examination Record is to be completed and signed by your personal health care provider. The front side needs to be completed by your health care provider, and the back side needs to be completed by a parent or guardian. This form is included in your admission application packet and is also available in the school clinic.
- Ohio law requires that each student must have evidence on file by the fifteenth (15th) day of entry to school that he/she has received or is in the process of receiving required immunizations. Noncompliance is reason for exclusion from school.

OUR FORMS ARE REQUESTED BY JUNE 1ST BUT ARE REQUIRED BY SEPTEMBER 1ST!

- 3. Please inform me of any health issues or allergy concerns that your child may have. We have an additional form to be completed if your child has an allergy.
- 4. No medication, not even over the counter medication, can be given to your child unless we have an "Authorization for Medication" form completed. This form must have the health care provider's signature, as well as the parent's signature, for us to administer any medication here at school. The authorization form is included in the August family packet and is also available in the school clinic.
- 5. If your child is experiencing any of the following symptoms within 24 hours of attending school, please keep him/her home to recover:
 - A temperature of 100° or higher
 - Any vomiting
 - Any diarrhea
 - A persistent cough
 - Excessive fatigue
