WHAT IS SCREENING?

Incarnation screens all children before they enter our Early Childhood or Kindergarten programs. The screening process is a team approach and includes a vision and hearing check, speech and language screening, gross and fine motor assessment, and a reading-writing readiness inventory. The results are used as a base line to guide our recommendations for appropriate program placements. Screening is held in mid-March each year. Individual times are scheduled when students register.

THE TEAM APPROACH

Incarnation offers a 'team' approach to developing literacy in Early Fives and Kindergarten. The team consists of the classroom teacher, Literacy Specialist, and the Speech-Language Pathologist. They have scheduled meetings to discuss curriculum, share materials and information, and review students' progress.

After the initial screening, all Kindergarten students are screened three times throughout the year (fall, winter and spring) to determine each student's current level of performance and progress. The primary purpose of the screenings is to ascertain speech, language and phonological awareness skills.

KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM

The Kindergarten program is a planned part of the total educational program at Incarnation School. Incarnation's all day program provides successful experiences based upon each child's stage of development. In our nurturing environment, the foundation is laid for future social and academic skills. Children must be five by September 30th of the registration year.

GOALS

- learn about life through religious instruction
- learn to work and play together in a classroom environment
- develop/improve large and fine motor skills
- enhance/develop listening skills
- develop a love of learning
- experience success in learning in order to build a positive self-concept
- develop and strengthen the foundation for academic learning
- class size is 20 students.
