NET Ministries:

NET Ministries challenges young Catholics to love Christ and embrace the life of the Church. Every August, 175 young Catholics aged 18-28 leave behind their jobs, school, family, and friends to devote nine months to serving with the National Evangelization Teams (NET). Divided into teams, they travel across the U.S. for nine months to share the Gospel with young people and their families. Since 1981, NET teams have led over 32,000 retreats and ministered to more than 1.9 million young Catholics.

Mr. Danny Dunn, junior high religion teacher, researched and coordinated two NET Ministries retreats with the school's seventh and eighth grade students. On Monday, April 30th, eighth grade students spent the day growing closer to God; seventh grade students spent Friday, May 4th in retreat with the NET team members. The students participated in small group sessions, played games, and spent time in the chapel praying. Feedback from the students was excellent, and they voiced their appreciation for Mr. Dunn's hard work and efforts.

Enrollment:

School enrollment for the 2017-2018 school year was very strong with 918 students. Enrollment for 2018-2019 is preliminarily very strong and 900 students are currently enrolled. Quite a few families move into the area over the summer, and *Mrs. Kim Shields*, school registrar, has been talking with many interested families. Tours have been scheduled and will continue into the summer months. Tours are a very successful avenue for bringing new families into the school; 98% of families toured join the Incarnation School family. While several grades have waitlists, there are still a few openings in various grades.

Eighth Grade Trip to Washington, D.C.:

One of the highlights of the eighth grade year at Incarnation is the trip to DC. This has been an annual occurrence for many years, and students and parent-chaperones make memories for a lifetime. Our current tour company is K&K Tours, based out of Celina, Ohio. Founded by former educators, K&K's goal is to give every student a hands-on American history experience and to bring the country's true heritage to light. A strong emphasis is placed on the Declaration

of Independence, patriotism, and sacrifice. The current eighth grade students departed for DC on Monday, April 30 and returned to Centerville on Friday, May 4. Thank you to **Father Stretch**, who blessed the 146 students, chaperones, staff, guides, and drivers prior to departure. Highlights of the trip included: Mass and tour of the Basilica of the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, tour of the Capitol Building, visit to Mount Vernon, and all of the monuments, and memorials. Thank you to the many chaperones and the Incarnation School staff who accompanied the students on the trip and contributed to its success.
