# INCARNATION CATHOLIC SCHOOL REPORT: February 4, 2019 Leah Coghlan, Principal

#### Catholic Schools Week:

This year, Catholic Schools Week had many wonderful highs:

- Letters of thanks were written to the parish parishioners. Students thanked the parishioners for their support of the school.
- Two mission collections were completed. Students in prek-4 brought in dignity items to be placed in *Blessing Bags*. These bags were initiated and supported through a grant written for the St. Remy Project at the University of Dayton. The *Blessing Bags* will be donated to St. Vincent de Paul. Students in grades 5-8 brought in single serving items to support the Centerville Food2Go program. This initiative sends food home with students who experience insecurities in that area.
- 250 pizzas provided a fun lunch on student appreciation day, and students were able to view music videos made by their peers. The faculty did not contribute a video this year; instead, electing to provide live entertainment throughout the program. The teachers brought down the house with an Incarnation Lip Sync Battle. Four inflatable T-Rex dinosaurs made appearances throughout the day to celebrate the students' special day.
- *Mrs. Sherri Masline,* music teacher, and our students helped Fr. Smith celebrate the parish Catholic Schools Week Mass on Friday morning. Friday afternoon ended Catholic Schools Week with a schoolwide family-style game hour as students brought non-electronic games from home to share with their classmates.

## School Enrollment:

The 2018-2019 school year began with a student enrollment of 886 children. After changes due to relocation of several families during the year and enrollment of new families, the current enrollment is 885. New student registration, including early childhood and kindergarten children, begins Sunday, February 24<sup>th</sup>. Data is tracking toward a strong enrollment number: in the 2017-2018 school year, six tours were given to date. In the 2018-2019 school year, 21 tours have been given to date. This interest has been very exciting! School Registrar, *Mrs. Kim Shields*, reports that interest is extremely high and she is receiving many calls and emails each day from interested and prospective families.

#### Knights of Columbus Essay Winners:

Each year, students from the Dayton area compete in the Knights of Columbus Vocations Essay Contest. This year, students were challenged to write an essay in which they described a day in the life of a priest, religious brother, or sister. Teachers invited priests and religious brothers and sisters into their classrooms to share their lives with the students. All students from grades 4 through 8 submitted essays and were judged by the Knights of Columbus Council and seminarians. *Mr. Ed Ponder*, from the Monsignor Lawrence K. Breslin Council, congratulated the winning students and gave them certificates following the all-school Mass on Friday, January 25th.

#### Junior High Science Fair:

Students in seventh and eighth grades prepare and present a science fair project as part of the rigorous science curriculum. They begin work in September by selecting their topic and formulating a question, hypothesis, and procedure. Research, testing, and data collection commences and is all showcased for judging. On January 24<sup>th</sup>, 162 projects were presented to 47 judges. All judges work in scientific fields and judged projects that related directly to their areas of expertise. 68 projects earned superior ratings (there were two perfect scores!) and are eligible to continue onto the Montgomery County Science Fair on March 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Dayton Convention Center. Thank you to the Junior High Science Teachers, *Mrs. Cassie Garison and Mrs. Corrie Weckesser* for their time, talent, and dedication to the students.
