Extra-curricular Activities and Clubs

Sports programs (4-8) through the CYO include: basketball. football, track, soccer, volleyball, cheerleading, and golf. Intramural basketball, volleyball, and track (K-3); 4th Gr. Musical Performing Group; Scouting programs for boys and girls; Parish children's choir; Muse Machine Art Club; Jazz Band; Destination Imagination (Competitive creativity); Lego League. Junior High Programs: Crusader Club Merit Service program; Optimist Youth Group; Closed circuit TV Morning Newscast (8th grade); Yearbook Committee; Jr. High Dances.

Bus Service

The School Districts of Centerville, Miamisburg, Springboro, Kettering, and Sugarcreek/Bellbrook provide bus service for students living in their districts. Other school districts provide reimbursement compensation.

School Lunch Program

A hot lunch program is provided by W.G. Grinders. Lunch prices per day are \$3.25 (grades P4-2) and \$3.50 (grades 3-8.) Ala carte items are available daily and gluten free items are available by special order. A computerized debit system is in place. Funds may be added to your child's account by check, cash, or online payment.

School Hours

The school building doors are opened at 8:10 a.m. and classes begin at 8:30. The school day ends at 3:15. Kindergarten program is full day. Our half-day Early Fives and Preschool 4's programs run from 8:30-11:30 AM and 12:25-3:15 PM.

2018-19 Tuition Payments / Fees

Tuition is paid through the FACTS tuition plan by automatic withdrawal for ten payments throughout the school year beginning on August 1st. A reduction is given for those paying in full by June 30th. Discounted rates are given for parishioners and families with multiple students. Foreign students on F1 or B2 visas are charged a special rate. Tuition rate tables with details are available online and in the school office. Other annual fees include technology fees and activity fees (vary by grade level.) A \$200 per family fee is due at registration for all new students. There is no charge to re-enroll current students.

Financial Aid

Applications for tuition aid are provided by the parish and are approved by the Pastor. Incarnation School participates in the Ohio EdChoice Scholarship Program, the Pay It Forward Grant Program through Alter High School, and the Catholic Education Foundation of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.
